Green is the color of the Irish and its also the color of good luck. For the superstitious, it is the flower to have around at home when you need a little bit of extra luck.

- Molucella is a very versatile commercial flower - the spiky stems make an interesting and long-lasting fresh cutflower arrangement

## **TECHNICAL INFORMATION**

## **CROP TIME**

From planting to harvest: 14 weeks.

### PLANTING DENSITY

80 plants/m<sup>2</sup>net (7 plants /ft.<sup>2</sup>net ).

# **PRE-PLANTING**

Soil: Well drained, loose soil with no clusters. At least 25 cm (10 in) deep. pH: 5.5 to 6.5 Netting: 2-3 levels

### LEAF REMOVAL

Nine (9) weeks after planting, remove the leaves from the lower half of the stem.

# Lateral Branch Removal.

Ten (10) weeks after planting, remove lateral branches.

# IRRIGATION

For plants to root well, maintain soil's humidity at field's capacity for the first 3 weeks after planting. At week 5, reduce irrigation to induce the plant's stems.

During production, maintain an irrigation volume of 5 to 5.5 l/m<sup>2</sup> according to the environmental and organoleptic monitoring.

#### FERTILIZATION

A general fertilization formula can be the following:

N: 120 ppm P: 40 ppm K: 160 ppm Ca: 120 ppm Mg: 60 ppm S: 50 ppm Fe: 2 ppm Mn: 2.5 ppm Cu, Zn y B: 0.2 ppm.

### HARVEST

Harvest when the stem has the appropriate length, rather than the flower opening.

#### POSTHARVEST TREATMENT

Hydrate in solution with Crhrysal Professional 2, 10 cc/l. during 4 hours.

#### PESTS & DISEASES

Leaf miner Thrips Pythium sp Cercospora sp

The plant is very susceptible to phytotoxicities.
