The genus name comes from the Greek word “trachelos” meaning neck, this references to the plant’s use in traditional herbal medicine to treat sore throats and other tracheal ailments. This also explains the common name throatwort. Trachelium plays versatile roles in floral work, working well as a filler in both fresh and dry arrangements. It is especially prized for its interesting texture, umbrella-like shape, full clusters and broad availability in colors. Its flowers also feature a delicate scent, like a lilac.

The flowers are lightly scented, light and lacy, and are found in a profusion of colours. Foliage is medium green unless noted. The Lake varieties have excellent vase life.

TECHNICAL INFORMATION

CROP TIME

From planting to harvest: 16-18 weeks

PLANTING DENSITY

66 plants/m² net without pinch
24 plants/m² net with pinch

PRE-PLANTING

Soil: A well drained soil is required. Work the bed to a depth of at least 25 cm deep.

pH: 6.0

Netting: 2-3 levels

ADDITIONAL LIGHTNING

Obligated long day, it needs 16-hour daylength. Start light 4 weeks after planting.

TEMPERATURE

(Day) 60–78°F (13°C)
(Night) 52–68°F (11°C)

FERTILIZATION

175 to 225 ppm N - 1.2 to 1.5 EC

HARVEST

Harvest when half or more of florets are open.

Hydrate in AVB (1 cc/liter) and AVB booster (1cc/liter) for 4 hours. Then hydrate in Chrysal professional 2 (10 cc/liter) for 2 hours.

Store at 4°C
